

Health care's lobbying army

Nearly 360 former staffers who worked for leaders of Congress, or for the Senate and House committees that drafted the health care bills, were registered lobbyists in 2008 or 2009. About 75 percent of those former staffers turned lobbyists worked for clients that reported lobbying on health-related issues in 2008 or 2009. Among the dozens of fomer high-ranking Congressional staffers who now lobby for clients with health interests, there are 14 former chiefs of staff and four former deputy chiefs of staff.
